

In Reception we follow the Early Years Framework. History is covered through The Understanding The World: Past and Present area of learning. The children will learn to:

Talk about members of their immediate family and community	We will listen to what children say about their family; share information about our own family, giving children time to ask questions or make comments We will use examples from real life and from books and show children how there are many different families.
Name and describe people who are familiar to them	Talk about people that the children may have come across within their community, such as the police, the fire service, doctors and teachers. Listen to what children say about their own experiences with people who are familiar to them.
Comment on images of familiar situations in the past	We will present children with pictures, stories, artefacts and accounts from the past, explaining similarities and differences. Show images of familiar situations in the past, such as homes, schools, and transport. Offer opportunities for children to begin to organise events using basic chronology.
Compare and contrast characters from stories including figures from the past	We will share texts, images, and tell oral stories that help children begin to develop an understanding of the past and present. Feature fictional and non-fictional characters from a range of cultures and times in storytelling. We will also introduce characters from the past, using songs, poems, puppets, role play and other storytelling methods.
